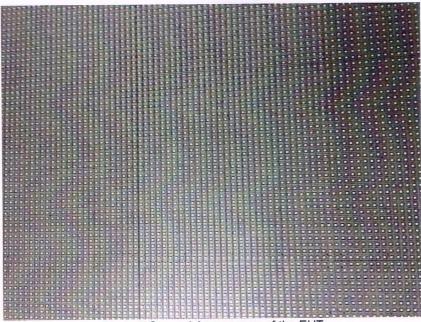

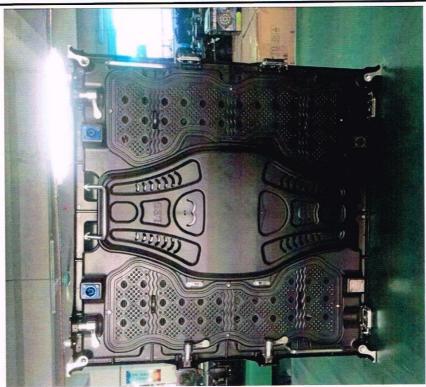


Photo 3 General Appearance of the EUT

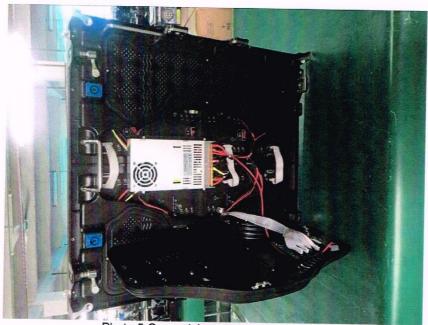

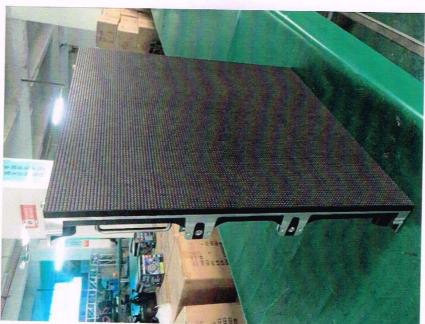
